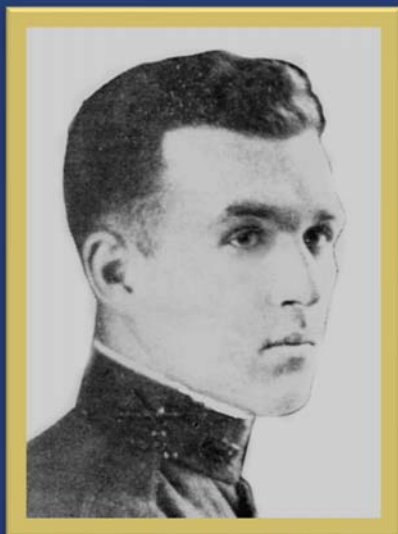


World War I



1st Lt. Allan W. Douglass
U.S. Army
Age 23

Born -September 25, 1895 Plainfield, New Jersey
Entered Service - April 1917 New Haven, Connecticut

Allan grew up in Buffalo New York where he received his primary and secondary education. He was a student at Yale University when the war started and promptly enlisted. On November 8, 1917 he was assigned to Battery "C" 301 Field Artillery where he received his commission. On March 2, 1918, during a ten day leave, he married Rachel Capen of 479 Sherman Street and set up residence there, Allan was sent oversea May 28, 1918 as an aide to Brigadier General Winn but on September 11, 1918 he voluntarily resigned to rejoin his old artillery outfit. The next day they were involved in the St. Mihiel offensive with the Germans near Limey. He was wounded by a shell splinter but continued to remove the wounded and the dead until a bursting shell killed him instantly. Lt. Douglass was cited for valor and recommended for the Distinguished Service Cross.

Date of Death -September 12, 1918 Limey
Buried - St. Mihiel Cemetery Thiancourt
