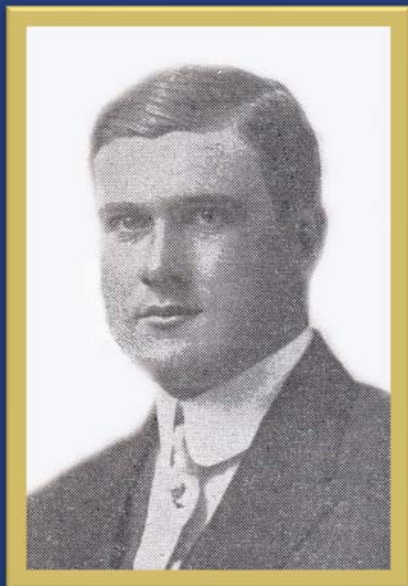


World War I

Born -April 18, 1889 Boston, Massachusetts
Entered Service - 1917 Canton, Massachusetts

Josiah's family moved to Canton when he was six where he attended the local schools. He started work at age sixteen at the New England Cotton Yarn Company in Boston. In his early twenties he traveled to California to seek employment but returned to Canton in 1915 to accept a job with Asbestos Protected Metal Co. In 1917 Josiah was called up in the second quota of the first draft and was assigned to the Supply Company of the 323rd Field Artillery. In the spring of 1918 Fuller was stricken by the infamous flu. Although stricken, he returned to duty too soon. He died of pneumonia April 16, 1918 two days before his 30th birthday at Camp Sherman Hospital Chillicothe, Ohio. Fuller's body was returned to Canton April 21 and buried at Canton Corner
