Dana grew up with a younger brother and two younger sisters. He attended the Eliot School, Canton High School and two years at Northeastern University. He was employed by Walker Wool Co. in South Boston before the war. After entering the service, he was trained as an aerial gunner and assigned to a B24 squadron in Italy. On April 25, 1944 his B24 was shot down over Austria. The entire crew was lost. At the end of the war, his remains were recovered, but they could not be identified from those of two other crew members. For that reason, in November 1951, Dana Igo was buried together with Sgt. Charles Austin and 2nd Lt. Glen Eby under a common headstone in Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery grave 73C section 88 St. Louis, Mo.
